GLASS WARDROBES

Forget traditional wardrobes – they've been reinvented as vitrines that put your clothes on display

The wardrobe is a functional piece of furniture, but rarely a thing of beauty – and possibly the last element of the home that's almost universally clunky and awkward. Well, now that's all changing: Belgian designer Vincent Van Duysen has created 'Master Dressing', his gamechangingly sleek, glass wardrobe for Molteni & C.

You'll no longer have to hide away your most prized fashion purchases: this piece of furniture that turns your clothes into showpieces (granted, you may have to be bit more tidy and organised). The vitrine design of 'Master

Dressing' perfectly coordinates with Van Duysen's existing 'Gliss Master' wardrobes, and incorporates a purposebuilt shelving system, drawers, and tie and scarf racks, all intended to help you keep everything in order. Also, for the first time, a dressing table area, including a large mirror, can be built into the middle of the wardrobe, allowing accessories and cosmetics to sit side-by-side with clothes.
